Toolbox Spotlight

Designed to replace partial or total loss of one's fingers, these custom-designed and fabricated <u>Prosthetic Fingers</u> are powered by the remainder of each finger. Three different devices are available: the PIPDriver (for amputees who still have their middle joint), the MCPDriver (for amputees with finger loss closer to the knuckle joint), and the ThumbDriver (for amputees with loss of the thumb).

In November, the team assisted Little Wound School in Kyle, SD, in applying for and receiving a Team Nutrition Grant and applying for the EQIP cost-share program through USDA-NRCS towards getting a high-tunnel set up at the school for their farm-to-school program. More

The team is also assisting seven AgrAbility clients on Pine Ridge, two incubator-hubs, and two schools, including Little Wound School mentioned above, in applying for a SARE farmer/rancher group grant and for a Farm-To-School Implementation Grant.



The team's partnership with the Oglala Sioux Tribal Land Office and USDA-NRCS Tribal Liaison's office and their EQIP program successfully secured funding from the Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) towards getting an additional 10 high tunnels to go up across the reservation starting next spring. More

The team's work with the Pine Ridge Food Sovereignty Coalition's planning committee has introduced AgrAbility to all their partnering organizations, and staff will be co-hosting the 1st Annual Lakota Food Summit in Rapid City, SD, in February of 2018 as well as hosting a booth and doing a presentation on Tribal AgrAbility at this upcoming conference.

The team is also nearing completion of a "Tribal New Farmers Resource Guide." More

The AgrAbility team also officially moved into their newly built office at 536, BIA 23, Porcupine, SD on one of the two incubator-hub sites that they partner with. This new office will be the main assistive technology center on Pine Ridge Reservation and sits on 160 acres that the team and their partners will be developing... More
